Site introduction

Town common SSSI is 146 ha lowland heathland site near Christchurch. The site is also SAC, SPA and Ramsar. The work described here is part of a ten year management plan:


Overall description, desired outcome.

Heathland restoration. Removal of native and non-native invasive tree/shrub species to restore each unit to a habitat favourable to endangered Protected Species following the desired prescription as set out in the St Catherine's Hill & Town Common Management plan. Sensitive conservation work with minimal impact in each working unit.

Timber and all brash to be extracted from site as chip or cord wood as agreed*. Work areas to be completed by February 28th 2019.

*In house Field Staff will also be present on site carrying regular heathland maintenance work throughout the winter season.
